



The Mason Family

Gary and Shay Mason and their four kids were facing the very real prospect of homelessness when they learned about the Operation Homefront Village in Gaithersburg, Md., one of three rentfree transitional housing communities for wounded warriors. At the time, they were staying at a hotel because their water-damaged condo was uninhabitable.

Gary medically retired from the Army as a captain in 2015 after 15 years, including one deployment to Iraq and two to Afghanistan. In addition to back and ankle injuries, he suffers from post-traumatic stress disorder. Shay, herself an Army veteran, serves as his primary caregiver.

All Village residents must attend support groups, workshops and financial counseling sessions to help ensure their success as they move forward. For Gary, that also means attending American University to pursue a degree in radio, television and video.

"Living at Operation Homefront's Village is an opportunity—a tremendous blessing and stress relief."

"We can save money, repair our credit, re-stabilize our children and focus on getting healthier as a family," said Gary.

OPERATION HOMEFRONT TRANSITIONAL HOUSING

Operation Homefront's Transitional Housing (Villages) program provides rent-free, two and three bedroom apartments to wounded, ill and injured warriors and their families as they leave the military. Many of these families face the financial burdens associated with traveling back and forth to be with their loved one when they are far apart, as well as the challenges of their service member's recovery and rehabilitation processes.

The Villages are designed to enable families to heal together, while bridging what can be a lengthy gap between when military pay ends and veteran benefits begin, or when veterans' disability claims are reviewed and received.

Our Villages relieve the financial stress and provide a comprehensive package of individualized family support and financial planning services. Each participating family is provided with:

- Rent-free, utility-free, fully furnished apartment
- Case management and customized transition plans
- One-on-one financial counseling
- Assistance with medical referrals
- Employment coaching and educational guidance
- Support network

The injured and their families experience a supportive environment among understanding peers, and most make impressive financial progress during their stay, leaving the Village debt free, or nearly so, with an emergency savings plan in place.
